



Annual Summary 2019-2020 School Year

Clarendon Christian Learning Center (CCLC) ministered to 851 students during the 2019-2020 school year!

District 2

26 High school (grades 9-12) students in District 2 were taught by Kim DuRant (second semester) assisted by Pastor Walt Proctor. Old Testament and New Testament offered two opportunities to earn 1 elective credit each. Classes were held in CCLC building adjacent to Manning High School. In the spring, students enjoyed a visit from missionary Ben Clary of JAARS, a neighboring ministry in Waxhaw, NC. Mr. Clary and his wife were able to present details of their work in Papua New Guinea translating the Bible into native languages. CCLC was delighted to include various Manning High School classes in these presentations focusing on the areas of language, culture, and translation. The presentations were held in the Manning High School Lecture Hall to accommodate the large number of attendees.

17 Junior High students (grades 7 & 8) attended Bible classes taught by Kim DuRant first semester. Classes were held in the CCLC building adjacent to Manning High School. Walt Proctor assisted and Sue Jamison volunteered as needed.

236 Elementary (grades 4-6) students attended Bible classes taught by Kathy Daniels. Mrs. Daniels was assisted by Kathleen McElveen and bus driver Leroy McElveen. Students were bussed from Manning Elementary School to CCLC classroom next to Manning Police Department.

242 Primary (grades 2 & 3) students attended Bible classes taught by Jennifer DuRant with Elizabeth Ann Geddings and Elizabeth Coleman assisting. Children walked over from Manning Primary School to the main campus of CCLC. The schedule was altered for them to attend every other week, instead of weekly.

District 3

139 middle school students attended Bible classes at the walk-over Pope St. location. These students committed to one 9 week term taught daily by Frankie Green with new classes beginning quarterly. Students presented memory verses, testimony, and music at quarterly programs for parents and the community prior to early closure.

191 elementary students (grades 3-5) attended Bible class once weekly all year. Sally Knauer taught and was assisted by Amanda Rabon. Fifth grade Bibles were presented during the drive through "graduation" at Walker Gamble.

Lacie Cannon and Kendra Gibbons alternated in assisting all District 3 teachers as needed.

Curricula: The Bible and Route 52 are the main curricula for District 2 primary ministry. These are enhanced by using flannel board visuals and crafts. The Bible and Firm Foundations (adult



& children's versions) are the basic curricula for grades 4-12 in District 2. Teen Sunday School and Answers in Genesis are used in grades 3-8 in District 3. All classes begin and end with prayer and some scripture memory is required. Often high school classes, which are lengthier, begin with a reading in Proverbs or the book of James. High school students also pray for nations around the world using the resource book, Operation World, as a guide.

Local churches & Individuals: In addition to financial support and faithful prayer support, CCLC continues to be blessed by the ministry of local church groups & individuals who offer their services doing repairs, yard work, and donating various office and classroom supplies.

In the community: CCLC participated in the Barrineau Christmas parade.

Covid 19: The pandemic brought an abrupt end to "in person" classes on March 13. CCLC was able to send out lessons through the mail and conduct some interaction through Facebook. High school classes were completed for credit via emails.
