



Annual Summary 2022-2023 School Year

Clarendon Christian Learning Center (CCLC) ministered to 713 students during the 2022-2023 school year! Our schools now officially operate under one consolidated Clarendon County School District.

59 High school (grades 9-12) students attended classes taught by Kim DuRant assisted by Lysandra Walker and Jeannie Wilson. Old Testament and New Testament offered two opportunities to earn 1 elective credit each. Fall semester students toured Temple Sinai, an historic Reform synagogue located at 11 Church Street on the corner of West Hampton Avenue, in Sumter. Spring semester students participated in a field trip to JAARS (Jungle Aviation and Radio Service) a ministry located in Waxhaw, NC serving missionaries around the world. High school students were also encouraged to attend the county tent revival. Mrs. DuRant also hosted a Men's Night for male students and an afternoon Tea for females. End of the year "open house" class featured students sharing their knowledge and faith with family and friends.

168 Elementary (grades 4-6) students attended Bible classes taught by Kathy Daniels with Carole Evans assisting. Students are bussed from MES to CCLC classroom on Boyce St.

205 elementary students (grades 3-5) attended Bible class at CCLC next to Walker Gamble. Sally Knauer taught and was assisted by Lacie Cannon and Amanda Rabon. Mid-year Rose Kelly began assisting Lacie Cannon on Wednesdays. Bibles were presented to fifth graders at their final class which parents attended. Students also shared songs, crafts, and memory verses at this time.

117 Primary (grades 2-3) students attended Bible classes taught by Jennifer DuRant with Elizabeth Coleman assisting. Parents were invited to attend final classes when Bibles were presented and students shared what they learned.

21 junior high students attended Bible class in Manning with Pastor Aaron Gross and Heather Varn.

143 middle school students attended Bible classes at the Pope St. location. These students were taught by Frankie Green assisted by Kendra Gibbons.

Curricula: The Bible is the main curriculum for all CCLC students. Other curricula used include: Route 52, Firm Foundations (adult & children's versions as appropriate), Answers in Genesis, God's Rescue Mission, and The Biggest Story. All classes begin and end with prayer and some scripture memory is required. High school classes, which are lengthier, often include reading Proverbs or the book of James.

Local churches & Individuals: In addition to financial support and faithful prayer support, CCLC continues to be blessed by the ministry of local church groups & individuals who offer their services doing repairs, yard work, and donating various office and classroom supplies.

In the community: CCLC participated in the Barrineau Christmas parade.
