



Annual Summary 2020-2021 School Year

Clarendon Christian Learning Center (CCLC) ministered to 566 students during the 2020-2021 school year!

District 2

25 High school (grades 9-12) students in District 2 were taught **virtually and “in person” (as permitted)** by Kim DuRant assisted by Pastor Walt Proctor. Old Testament and New Testament offered two opportunities to earn 1 elective credit each.

160 Elementary (grades 4-6) students attended Bible classes taught by Kathy Daniels and Jennifer DuRant with Elizabeth Ann Geddings assisting. Classes were held **virtually** for the entire school year.

84 Primary (third grade) students attended **virtual** Bible classes taught by Jennifer DuRant with Elizabeth Ann Geddings assisting.

District 3

156 middle school students attended **“in person”** Bible classes at the walk-over Pope St. location. These students were taught by Frankie Green assisted by Kendra Gibbons. CCLC responded to the scheduling changes as set by the District.

141 elementary students (grades 4-5) attended Bible class **virtually** each morning. Sally Knauer taught and was assisted by Amanda Rabon. Craft packages and fifth grade Bibles were delivered to the school for distribution.

Curricula: The Bible and Route 52 are the main curricula for District 2 primary ministry. The Bible and Firm Foundations (adult & children’s versions) are the basic curricula for grades 4-12 in District 2, as well as, grades 4-8 in District 3. *Teen Sunday School*, Answers in Genesis, and other supplements are sometimes added when appropriate. All classes begin and end with prayer and some scripture memory is required. High school classes, which are lengthier, began with a reading in Proverbs or the book of James. Virtual lessons often included Christian videos and music in place of crafts and flannel board illustrations.

Local churches & Individuals: In addition to financial support and faithful prayer support, CCLC continues to be blessed by the ministry of local church groups & individuals who offer their services doing repairs, yard work, and donating various office and classroom supplies. This year our former Chairman of the Board, Steve Wearden, brought the youth from his church, Christ Community, Simpsonville, SC, which included former CCLC teacher, Paul Sanders’ son and daughter, to do a mission project. This group did yardwork and stained the fence and decks. A local men’s mission group reworked our deck at the Boundary St. location.

In the community: CCLC participated in the virtual Barrineau Christmas parade.
